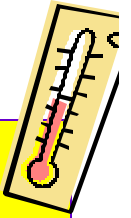

A few fences facing the park have broken boards that need to be replaced. We have a supply of boards that are available free for your use. During the architectural walk through, it was very evident that the end of beams on many of the homes have dry rot. Many of the beams also have small cracks that will allow water to enter which encourages dry rot if the cracks are not filled and painted. Some of the beams on my own house had dry rot that wasn't visible because the paint was covering it. I recommend everyone inspect their beams for this kind of damage.

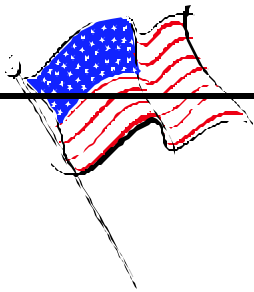

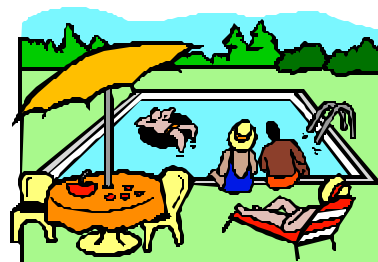
